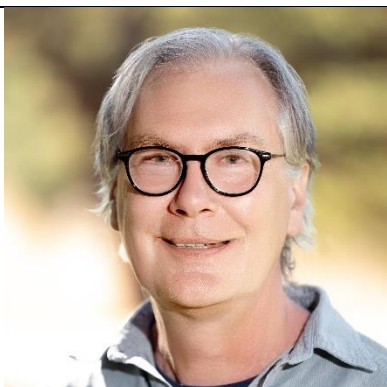


Jeannie Perales (she/her)
